### The European Defence Fund: key facts

- Continuity with precursors but a step change in means and ambition:
  - → Four times higher annual budget
  - → Integrated research (R) and development (D) windows
  - → Balance: cooperation/competition & large capabilities/innovation
- Open for EEA countries (Norway is associated)
- Security-based participation conditions for third countries controlled entities



## The European Defence Fund: general objectives slido.com

- Supports collaborative and cross-border projects in research and development on defence technologies and capabilities
- Contributes to the competitiveness and innovation capacity of the EDTIB, including by encouraging participation of SMEs and other actors that are usually not active in the defence domain
- Contributes to reducing fragmentation of the Europe defence and industrial landscape
- Helps maximising the outcome of defence expenditure (i.e. spending more, better and together)
- Strengthens Europe's resilience and its strategic autonomy, notably by reducing EU technological dependencies on third countries




### The European Defence Fund: general principles

- Demand is mainly driven by the Member States
- Need to be selective
- Complementarity and consistency with priorities commonly agreed by Member States and other EU defence initiatives and NATO
- Need to target projects that bring real strategic and economic benefit for Europe, are game changers for EU armed forces and would not materialise if not undertaken jointly
- Need to ensure continuity of already funded and completed actions
- Important for EDF to be inclusive and to offer fair opportunities for companies of all sizes from all Member States and associated countries
- Support to innovation: 4%-8% of the EDF budget must be dedicated to disruptive technologies
- Seek synergies with other EU programmes: avoid unnecessary duplications in funding and trigger cross-fertilisation
- No EDF support for actions that lead to defence capabilities prohibited by international law



### The European Defence Fund: life cycle

- Annual work programmes and calls for proposals
- Double comitology: Programme Committee to give opinion on the annual work
  programme to be adopted by the Commission and on the selection of projects to be funded
  following the calls for proposals







### Articulation with other EU initiatives and programmes



- EDF annual Work programmes informed by:
  - Capability Development Plan (CDP): consistency with commonly agreed priorities
  - Coordinated Annual Review on Defence (CARD): opportunities for collaborative R&D
  - Permanent Structured Cooperation (PESCO) projects
  - Synergies and complementarity with other EU programmes



### EDF 2021 Calls structure

- Naming convention: EDF-2021-Category of action acronym-R/D-Topic name acronym
- Each call includes one or more topics to be covered by the call budget
- Each proposal shall be submitted against one topic



- Each topic structured in sections
  - Specific Challenge: context setting and description problem/shortfall to be solved/addressed (capability, technology, operational,...)
  - Scope

  - Functional requirements
  - **Expected Impact**



- Specific <u>deliverables/tasks/implementation options</u>: e.g. specific deliverables/tasks (e.g. CONOPS/architecture definition),, implementation of demonstrators, targeted prototypes, definition of the type of testing,....
- Optional upstream or downstream activities (<u>when specified</u>): only taken into account in award criteria (NO ELIGIBILITY)

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## EDF 2021 Topics: requirements and impact

## Disruptive technologies for defence

'Disruptive technology for defence' means an enhanced or completely new technology that brings about a radical change, including a paradigm shift in the concepts and conduct of defence affairs such as by replacing existing defence technologies or rendering them obsolete'

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



Admissibility Conditions - formal requirements related to the submission and presentation of proposal



Submitted before the call deadline (9 December 2021 – 17.00 CET)



Submission forms and supporting documents need to be provided as searchable pdf files, unless otherwise specified



Submitted electronically via the Funding & Tenders Portal Electronic Submission System



Proposal in one of the official languages of the Union (English language is encouraged)



Proposals (w/annexes and supporting documents) must be complete and submitted using the forms

$$\frac{1}{\text{Proposal}} = \frac{1}{\text{Topic}}$$

Each proposal must only be submitted against one topic



#### **EUROPEAN DEFENCE FUND - INFO DAY 2021**



Exclusion criteria - determine if applicants and affiliated entities falls under exclusion grounds

Article 136 of the Regulation 2018/1046 applies

### Exclusion grounds:

- Bankruptcy, insolvency, being in an arrangement with creditors, suspension of its business activities, etc.
- breach of its obligations relating to the payment of taxes or social security contributions in accordance with the applicable law
- grave professional misconduct by having violated applicable laws or regulations or ethical standards of the profession
- fraud, corruption, conduct related to a criminal, money laundering or terrorist financing, terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, child labour or other offences concerning trafficking in human beings
- significant deficiencies in complying with main obligations in the implementation of a legal commitment financed by the budget
- irregularity within the meaning of Article 1(2) of Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 2988/95 (infringement of a provision of Community law [...] which has, or would have, the effect of prejudicing the general budget of the Communities or budgets managed by them [...]
- Creation of an entity in a different jurisdiction with the intent to circumvent fiscal, social or any other legal obligations

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## Eligibility of entities participating in the action

### **Beneficiaries/recipients**

- Members of the consortium / signatories of the GA
- → Need to fulfil eligibility req.
- → Can claim their own costs

#### **Affiliated entities**

- Third parties with a legal/capital link with beneficiary that can implement part of the action in their own name
- → Need to fulfil same eligibility req.
- → Can claim their own costs

#### Subcontractors involved in the action

- Subcontractors with a direct contractual relationship to beneficiary;
- Other subcontractors to which at least 10% of the total eligible cost of the action is allocated;
- Subcontractors which may require access to classified information to carry out the action.
- → Need to fulfil same eligibility req.
- → Beneficiary/affiliated entity can charge invoice as subcontracting costs





## Eligibility of entities participating in the action

### **Associated partners**

- Entities established outside the territory of the Union or Norway
- Entities controlled by a non-EU/non-Norway country/ entity
- **→Work packages cannot be allocated to them**
- → Need to fulfil different eligibility conditions
- **→Costs not eligible for funding**

### Other subcontractors and suppliers

- Do not need to fulfil any eligibility conditions
- → Beneficiary/affiliated entity can charge their invoice as subcontracting costs or other direct costs



## Eligibility of entities participating in the action

**Consortia:** at least three eligible entities established in at least three different MS/AC (exception: calls for disruptive technologies: at least two – EDF-2021-XXX-RDIS)

- Only legal entities
- Established in the territory of the Union\* (EU) or of Norway (AC)
- Infrastructure, facilities, assets and resources located in the Union /Norway (Annex 7) – unless no competitive substitutes in EU/Norway
- Executive management structures established in the Union/Norway
- Non-controlled by non-EU/non-Norway country / entity



## Eligibility of entities participating in the action

**EU-control derogation**: entities established in the EU/Norway but controlled by non-EU/non-Norway country/entity <u>can participate in the action</u> **IF** conditions relating to **security and defence interests of the Union** and its **Member States** are met:

- No risk in the ability to perform the action (security of supply)
- Sensitive information not accessible to non-EU/non-Norway country/entity (security of information)
- No transfer of IP (IPR remains in the EU/Norway)

**Guarantees** approved by Member States/Norway required: measures in place must be substantiated



# Eligibility of entities: control



- Control: ability to exercise a decisive influence on an entity, directly or indirectly through one or more intermediate entities

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

# Eligibility of actions

- **Ineligible**: products/technologies which use, development or production is prohibited by applicable **international law**
- Ineligible: Lethal autonomous weapons without the possibility for meaningful human control over selection and engagement decisions when carrying out strikes against humans\*
- Background and generated foreground IP shall not be subject to any control or restriction by non-EU/non-Norway countries/entities (Annex 4)

<sup>\*</sup> without prejudice to the possibility of providing funding for actions for the development of early warning systems and countermeasures for defensive purposes



## Eligibility of actions Development actions only

- Costs of the action not covered by Union support are to be covered by other means of financing (e.g. Member States/Norway co-financing)
- Design activities must be based on harmonized defence capability requirements jointly agreed by at least two Member States or Norway
- System prototyping and beyond:
  - must be based on common technical specifications jointly agreed by the Member States or Norway that are to co-finance or that intend to jointly procure the final product or to jointly use the technology
  - at least two Member States or Norway need to show their intention to procure the final product or to use the technology in a coordinated way, including through joint procurement where applicable.



# Criterion 1: Excellence

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

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




#### EDF 2021 Calls - Indicative timeline







#### Eligible costs / Ineligible costs

- Eligibility: specific approach of what EU budget can finance
  - → Expenses which are necessary for the implementation of action
- Eligibility criteria defined in the Financial Regulation and in the specific legal basis
  - → Valid for direct and indirect costs...
  - → ...and for actual cost or lump sum grants (a lump sum is fixed on the basis of estimated actual eligible costs at the end of the action)





#### Eligible costs / Ineligible costs

What are the costs which can be reimbursed by EDF budget?

#### Mix between:

- The generic definition of the Financial Regulation (Article 186 FR)

  Financial regulation applicable to the general budget of the Union Publications Office of the EU

  (europa.eu)
- Limitations from the EDF legal basis
- Additions made by the Commission in the EDF Call documents





Article 186(3) FR

- Eligible costs actually incurred by the beneficiary, as referred to in point (b) of the first subparagraph of Article 125(1), shall meet all of the following criteria:
  - (a) they are incurred during the duration of the action or of the work programme, with the exception of costs relating to final reports and audit certificates;
  - (b) they are indicated in the estimated overall budget of the action or work programme;
  - (c) they are necessary for the implementation of the action or of the work programme which is the subject of the grant;
  - (d) they are identifiable and verifiable, in particular being recorded in the accounting records of the beneficiary and determined according to the applicable accounting standards of the country where the beneficiary is established and according to the usual cost accounting practices of the beneficiary;
  - (e) they comply with the requirements of applicable tax and social legislation;
  - (f) they are reasonable, justified, and comply with the principle of sound financial management, in particular regarding economy and efficiency.





Article 186(3) FR

- Actual costs = 'actually incurred' (ex-post vision)
  - No provision
  - No contingencies
- Spent 'during the duration of the action'
  - Starts on or after the (1st day of the month following) grant agreement signature (exception, if justified by the applicant that the action needs to start before that date)
  - Ends at the date fixed in the grant agreement (exception for the costs of final report (including cost of CFS)) → request amendments if more time is needed for good reasons





- 'Indicated in the estimated overall budget'
  - The grant amount never increases
  - Budget transfers are possible, but amendments are required to create a new budget item, invite a new subcontractor or modify the scope of activities with higher co-financing rates
- 'Necessary for the implementation of the action'

The Commission rejects on this basis expenses which have nothing to do with the action (in direct or indirect costs)





- 'Identifiable and verifiable' & legal
  - Booked in the accounts and determined in accordance with the national accounting standards and the usual business practices of the beneficiary (depreciation, remuneration)
  - In compliance with tax and social legislation
- 'Comply with sound financial management'
  - The Commission rejects on this basis expenses which are excessive...
  - ...or those which do not comply with economy and efficiency (acquisition of goods & services and subcontracting through a procedure ensuring best value for money)





#### Limitations from the EDF Legal basis

Consider the restrictions to the eligibility of costs provided by:

- Articles 7 and 10.6 of EDF regulation (Ethics, guide for applicants page 30)
- Articles 9.5 and 9.6 (cost of infrastructure and assets located outside an EDF participating country)
- Article 20.3 of EDF regulation (ownership/control of the action's results by a non-EDF participating country)



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#### Additions in the Call documents

According to the *Guide for applicants*, are eligible:

• The cost of a bank guarantee required by the Commission before prefinancing payment is an eligible cost

Private entities must check their financial capacity before applying: <u>LFV Simulation (europa.eu)</u>

• Costs relating to the submission of the final report, including the cost of certificate of financial statements (CFS, <u>for actual cost grants</u> where the requested grant <u>for the applicant</u> is > EUR 406 000 if 25% flat rate for indirect costs; otherwise EUR 325 000)



- An allocation key based on m<sup>2</sup> is not considered precise enough to qualify costs like energy/heating as direct

- However, part-time involvement in the project is accepted if supported by a detailed time-sheet





#### Actual costs vs lump sums: common points


- Same evaluation criteria for lump sum calls and actual costs calls
- Most provisions of both MGAs are the same: IPR, confidentiality and security, proper implementation of the action, ethics, etc.
- Same payment scheme: pre-financing interim payment final payment
- Payments are made at the end of reporting periods and upon approval of a periodic report

#### Final remarks and additional resources

- Lump sums grants represent a significant simplification potential:
  - Slightly higher effort at proposal and GAP stage...
  - ... but major reduction of administrative burden during project implementation (and afterwards)
- Focus on performance: shift from financial management & cost control to technical work and achievement of results
- Methodology to establish lump sums in Authorising Decision

#### Evolutions compared to EDIDP

- Online submission process (Funding & Tender Portal)
  - Open since 9 September 2021
- New set of Submission forms
  - Some to be filled in **online**, some other to be filled in **offline**
  - Macro-enabled files for some of the Annexes
  - Latest versions of Submission forms, Calls and conditions, Guide for applicants and FAQ available on a dedicated DG DEFIS web page (accessible from the F&T portal)
- Do not wait for the last moment to get familiar with the forms and the submission process!
  - You can save application drafts on the F&T portal and resume any time before final submission deadline

  - Includes additional information regarding methodology used to establish personal costs
- Provide signed declarations as pdf files





#### Annex 4 – IPR on background information v1.0 slido.com

- Needed for eligibility check
- List IPR needed to perform the action that is not originating from EU or Norway
- Provide information about origin
- Provide information about rights that participants have, demonstrating that they can perform the proposed work
- Justify that the use of this IPR will not lead to restriction or control by nonassociated countries/entities over the results of the action
- Provide duly completed file(s) as pdf





#### Annex 5 – Industry related information v1.0

Expected from all applicants but will not impact evaluation of the proposal

#### **Objectives**

- To map EU's dependencies in the Aerospace and Defence (ASD) Ecosystem (dependency screening);


- Macro-enabled Excel file (do not wait last moment to test it!)
- Needed for each participant claiming the mid-cap status to:
  - Assess proposal against award criterion 5 (both for Research and Development calls)
    - Each applicant, affiliated entity and subcontractor involved in the action
  - Assess eligibility to mid-cap bonus (Development calls only)
    - Each applicant, affiliated entity, and their direct subcontractors
- Includes completeness and consistency checks: does not substitute your own checks and further assessment by the Commission services

  - No template provided





#### Supporting documents

- Eligibility of the participants:
  - Management structure established in EU or Norway
  - Evidence in case infrastructure, facilities, assets and resources located outside EU and Norway
  - Graph with chain of control (useful for Annex 6 and also for Annex 8)
  - Derogation regarding control (guarantees approved by national authorities)
  - Associated partners (to substantiate justification)





#### Supporting documents

- Eligibility of the action:
  - Co-financing by Member States or Norway, or by other stakeholders if costs not fully covered by EU funding (development actions only)
  - Harmonised defence capability requirements (design) and common technical specifications (prototyping +) (development actions only)
    - derogation regarding harmonised defence capability requirements / common technical specifications
