


The European Defence Fund is more relevant than ever. By encouraging cooperation in the development of Defence technologies and capabilities — it helps invest more, together, together, and European. It focuses on pooling talent when it comes to Research and Development, targeting priorities commonly agreed with Member States. It fosters a more integrated and capable European Defence Technological and Industrial Base. And it promotes interoperability of National Armed Forces by reducing duplication.

The Commission is intending to fund 54 additional EDF projects worth €1 billion, which will bring the total EU budgetary investments to more than €3 billion in collaborative defence R&D projects since the start of the EDF Regulation in May 2021. The selected proposals respond to the funding priorities of the 2023 EDF work programme, addressing 34 topics structured along four thematic calls for proposals, plus bottom-up calls focused on SMEs.

ESOCA will identify, define, and evaluate different options for future European strategic airlift capability, while NG-MIMA will revolutionise military avionics.



Ground

MARTE will design a new Main Battle Tank (MBT) platform, whilst FMBTech will develop a modular design for agile, adaptive, intelligent and cooperative future MBT systems. FIRES2 intends to combine two different types of ammunition into a new artillery projectile.

In addition, major projects will be funded in other categories such as Ground, CBRN, Soldier Protection, Underwater Warfare, as well as in technology areas such AI, Quantum, Cyber.
