#### PROTECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

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### 1. Introduction

The European Commission (hereafter 'the Commission') is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

This privacy statement concerns the processing operation for the Call for Expression of Interest for In-Orbit Demonstration and Validation (IOD/IOV) Experiments needing aggregation as well as for the Call for Expression of Interest for "Ready to Fly" IOD/IOV Satellites, undertaken by the Commission Directorate-General for Defence Industry and Space, Unit B.2 – Innovation, Startups and Economics as presented below.

### 2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

<u>Purpose of the processing operation</u>: The Commission collects and uses the personal information that you provide at the time of application within the framework of targeted Calls for Expression of Interest to establish a list of contacts to be able to communicate, via e-mail or other IT tool, with candidates considered for IOD/IOV activities. The list will not be published.

The personal data processed may be reused for the purpose of procedures before the EU Courts, national courts, the European Ombudsman or the European Court of Auditor.

# 3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data

We process your personal data, because processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest.

The Union law which is the basis for the processing based on Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 is the Treaty of the European Union, and more specifically its Articles 1 and 11, Article 298 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, read in conjunction with Recital 22 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725), as well as the Protocol 2 on the application of the principles of subsidiarity and proportionality.

# 4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

In order to carry out this processing operation *Directorate-General for Defence Industry and Space, Unit B.2 – Innovation, Start-ups and Economics* collects the following categories of personal data obtained by you:

- name and surname,
- e-mail address of the respondent;
- phone number.

### 5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing, namely for a maximum of five years after the closure of the file to which the present targeted consultation belongs. A file is closed at the latest once there has been a final outcome in relation to the initiative to which the targeted consultation contributed.

This administrative retention period of five years is based on the retention policy of European Commission documents and files (and the personal data contained in them), governed by the common Commission-level retention list for European Commission files <a href="SEC(2019)900">SEC(2019)900</a>. It is a regulatory document in the form of a retention schedule that establishes the retention periods for different types of European Commission files. That list has been notified to the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The administrative retention period is the period during which the Commission departments are required to keep a file depending on its usefulness for administrative purposes and the relevant statutory and legal obligations. This period begins to run from the time when the file is closed.

In accordance with the common Commission-level retention list, after the 'administrative retention period', files including (the outcome of) targeted consultations (and the personal data contained in them) can be transferred to the Historical Archives of the European Commission for historical purposes (for the processing operations concerning the Historical Archives, please

see record of processing 'Management and long-term preservation of the European Commission's Archives', registered under reference number <u>DPR-EC-00837</u>).

## 6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored on the servers of the Commission and its processor, the European Space Agency, in its capacity of implementing partner of the In-Orbit Demonstration and Validation Service. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to <a href="Commission Decision (EU, Euratom">Commission Decision (EU, Euratom</a>) 2017/46 of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the Commission.

The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your data on behalf of the Commission, and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the transposition of the General Data Protection Regulation in the EU Member States ('GDPR' Regulation (EU) 2016/679).

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

# 7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this *processing operation* and to authorised staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Where necessary, we may also share your information with the following contractors for the purposes of evaluation and processing of your application for the Call for Expression of Interest for In-Orbit Demonstration and Validation (IOD/IOV) Experiments needing aggregation and/or for the Call for Expression of Interest for "Ready to Fly" IOD/IOV Satellites:

- The European Space Agency (ESA) as well as other external independent experts for the evaluation;
- Carrier providers for candidates retained for aggregation services;
- Launch service providers for retained "ready to fly" IOD/IOV satellites.

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission's contractor responsible for carrying out the evaluation and to authorised staff according to the "need to know" principle.

The information we collect will not be given to any other third party, except to the extent and for the purpose we may be required to do so by law, including the possible transmission of personal data to EU bodies or institutions in charge of audit or inspection in accordance with the EU Treaties.

#### 8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Under certain conditions, you have the right to

erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a), on grounds relating to your particular situation.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the Data Controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.

Where you wish to exercise your rights in the context of one or several specific processing operations, please provide their description (i.e. their Record reference(s) as specified under Heading 10 below) in your request.

In accordance with Article 14(3) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, your request as a data subject will be handled within one month of receipt of the request. That period may be extended by two further months where necessary, taking into account the complexity and number of the requests. In such case, you will be informed of the extension of the time limit, together with the reasons for the delay.
